



# OAKLAND RAIDERS UPDATED BIOGRAPHIES

Through Week 15, entering Carolina game

## 28 Phillip Adams | DB | 5-11 | 195 | Third year | S. Carolina St.

**2012:** Has played in all 14 games, with one start...Claimed off waivers by Raiders from Seahawks, Aug. 31, less than 24 hours after returning kickoffs against Oakland in the preseason finale at CenturyLink Field (8/30)...**(9/10) vs. SD:** Returned a punt 15 yards in first quarter to set up game's initial points, a Sebastian Janikowski field goal; returned his first punts since 2010 with the 49ers...**(9/16) at Mia.:** Returned a third-quarter punt 47 yards, Oakland's longest in four years, to set up a field goal; also had 24- and 36-yard returns erased due to penalties...His 47-yard return was the longest by a Raider since Johnnie Lee Higgins' 80-yard touchdown vs. the Houston Texans on Dec. 21, 2008...**(10/14) at Atl.:** Played 17 snaps at cornerback...**(10/28) at KC:** Ripped off a 27-yard punt return late in the third quarter...**(12/2) vs. Cle.:** Registered his second career interception, picking off Brandon Weeden deep in Raiders territory to end a Browns drive late in first half; however, did not return (concussion) after colliding with teammate on same play...**(12/06) vs. Den.:** After missing most of the short week of preparations due to concussion, nearly intercepted Peyton Manning twice...First, picked off the future Hall-of-Famer with a diving interception at his own goal line in second quarter, snaring an underthrown ball...Then, nearly corralled another Manning pass late in second quarter, forcing a Broncos punt...Also beat a blocker to make a sure, third-down stop to force Denver to settle for third-quarter field goal...**(12/16) vs. KC:** Played well enough over a two-week period to supplant veteran starter Ron Bartell (waived), and made his first NFL start...Early in second quarter, knifed into the backfield to throw the AFC's leading rusher, Jamaal Charles, for a 3-yard loss...However, sustained a concussion on the play and did not return.

A wide receiver in college, provides the Raiders a speedy, athletic option at tight end...**(9/10) vs. SD:** Caught a 12-yard pass in the third quarter...**(9/16) at Mia.:** Set up a field goal just prior to halftime with a career-long 31-yard reception; on the play, used pure athleticism to stiff-arm a defender and gain 27 yards after the catch...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** Caught a 13-yard pass to help set up a game-tying, second-quarter TD, in a 34-31 win...**(10/14) at Atl.:** In heatbreaking loss at undefeated Falcons, made an athletic move to gain 12 yards and a first down, extending a field-goal drive...**(10/21) vs. Jac.:** Held without a catch, snapped a six-game reception streak, dating to 2011...**(11/11) at Bal.:** Caught two passes, an early career high, including a 20-yard third-down conversion on a wheel route down the sideline on Oakland's first drive.

**PRONUNCIATION:** kuh-LEEF

**2012:** Has played in seven games, all starts...Sustained a groin injury in Week 2 and underwent surgery Sept. 21 (Dr. Warren King, Fremont Surgery Center)...**(9/10) vs. SD:** Elected by his team as a game-week captain...**(9/16) at Mia.:** Strained a groin with two minutes left in first half and did not return...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** Inactive with groin injury, missing his first game since the end of the 2009 season (34 straight)...Also inactive for contests at Denver (9/30), at Atlanta (10/14), vs. Jacksonville (10/21), at Kansas City (10/28) and vs. Tampa Bay (11/4)...**(11/11) at Bal.:** After returning to practice Nov. 7, was inactive for game...**(11/18) vs. NO:** Returned to starting lineup in his first game since leaving with groin injury in Week 2; helped Marcel Reece to 103 rushing yards...**(12/16) vs. KC:** Held Chiefs without a sack for only the third time all year and helped pave path for 203 rushing yards, including 110 from Darren McFadden, in 15-0 win...Sealed off the right side to open hole for Mike Goodson's 43-yard run on last play of third quarter...Earlier, battled at the bottom of a pile to recover a fumble and preserve a second-quarter FG drive.

## 70 Tony Bergstrom | OL | 6-5 | 310 | Rookie | Utah

**2012:** Has dressed for 12 games and played in seven; inactive for two others...Versatile big man took preseason practice reps at both left and right guard, and tackle, to provide key depth on the Raiders' line...Inactive for season's first two games...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** Dressed for the first time, creating depth with Khalif Barnes (groin) inactive, but did not play...**(10/14) at Atl.:** Made his NFL debut, as part of the field-goal and PAT units...**(11/11) at Bal.:** Played most of the fourth quarter, taking his first snaps on the offensive line; began at guard before moving to tackle...**(11/18) vs. NO:** Saw several snaps as a blocking tight end, helping Marcel Reece to 103 yards on the ground...**(12/16) vs. KC:** As a blocking tight end, helped pave path for 203 rushing yards, including 110 from Darren McFadden, in 15-0 win.

**2012:** Has played in 11 games...Started preseason finale at Seattle (8/30) in place of Tommy Kelly (coaches' decision)... **(9/10) vs. SD:** Made his NFL debut, playing seven snaps on the defensive line...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** Inactive...**(10/14) at Atl.:** Inactive...**(10/21) vs. Jac.:** Saw several defensive snaps in 26-23 overtime victory...**(11/4) vs. TB:** Inactive...**(11/11) at Bal.:** Played several snaps on the interior, with starter Richard Seymour (hamstring) inactive...**(12/2) vs. Cle.:** Swatted away a Brandon Weeden pass, and put pressure on the QB just before Weeden released his second-quarter INT.

**PRONUNCIATION:** ty-VAHN

**2012:** Has played and started 13 games...Enters Week 16 with a team-leading 144 tackles ...Signed a long-term contract over the offseason, after the team designated him its franchise player... **(9/10) vs. SD:** Credited by coaches with two big hits and a pass broken up...**(9/16) at Mia.:** Posted at the time a career-best 16 tackles (11 solo), including two big hits; twisted an ankle in the third quarter, but returned to action...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** In 34-31 win, eclipsed his career high from the previous week with 17 tackles, two of which came on crushing hits...Also hurried Ben Roethlisberger to force a first-quarter incompleteness, and broke up a second-quarter pass to force a punt...**(9/30) at Den.:** Made a TD-saving tackle of Willis McGahee in first quarter, on a drive ending in a FG...**(10/14) at Atl.:** In second quarter of heartbreaking loss to undefeated Falcons, registered his first INT since 9/25/11, picking off Matt Ryan to set up a touchdown...**(10/21) vs. Jac.:** Nearly intercepted a second-quarter pass, unable to corral the throw at his feet...**(10/28) at KC:** In key road win, broke up a sure go-ahead touchdown in the end zone, a pass intended for Tony Moeaki, to force a field goal in the second quarter; then delivered a big hit on QB Matt Cassel to force an incompleteness just before half...**(11/4) vs. TB:** Dropped Doug Martin for a 1-yard loss with Oakland down 35-32 late in game, then two plays later made a third-down stop to force a punt...**(11/11) at Bal.:** Delivered a marrow-jarring hit on Jacoby Jones' third-quarter end-around run...**(11/18) vs. NO:** Inactive with a neck injury, sustained in Ravens contest; missed his first since the

end of the 2008 season, snapping a string of 57 games, all starts...**(11/25) at Cin.:** Returned to the lineup and helped force a first-quarter punt with his QB pressure on third down; later, in a 27-10 game with seven minutes left in the game, had what would've been a 22-yard fumble-return TD taken away after an inadvertent whistle by rule forced a replay of the down...**(12/2) vs. Cle.:** Slowed in fourth quarter by stinger...**(12/06) vs. Den.:** Injured an ankle early in game, then returned in the second quarter...Drew a holding penalty in the second half...**(12/16) vs. KC:** Missed most of the practice week (ankle), but still played every snap in 15-0 win, Oakland's first shutout in 10 years; helped limit Chiefs to 119 total yards, fewest by a Raiders defense since 1975...Stuffed AFC's leading rusher, Jamaal Charles, for no gain on third-and-1 in fourth quarter, helping Oakland match its franchise record by allowing just 10 rushing yards.

**PRONUNCIATION:** bry-ZELL

**2012:** Has started all 14 games...Nicknamed Biscuit, called a blue-collar grinder by offensive coordinator Greg Knapp...Known for his toughness, has spent his entire NFL career in the zone-blocking scheme... **(9/10) vs. SD:** Started his Raiders debut, at RG...**(9/16) at Mia.:** Threw a key block on a first-quarter screen to spring Mike Goodson on a 64-yard, game-tying TD...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** Created holes for Darren McFadden (113 rushing yards), including a point-of-attack block on a 64-yard TD in the first quarter...**(10/14) at Atl.:** Sustained a concussion midway through the second quarter, taking a knee to the head after throwing a downfield block on Mike Goodson's 37-yard screen reception, and did not return...**(10/21) vs. Jac.:** Passed all his tests to return to starting lineup in 26-23 overtime win, and provided a key block on Carson Palmer's game-tying TD late in regulation...**(10/28) at KC:** In 26-16 win, ushered McFadden to 114 rushing yards on a line that didn't allow a sack; made a block to spring McFadden on a 19-yard burst to give Oakland momentum on a third-quarter TD drive, then opened holes on runs by McFadden (28) and Goodson (21) on a fourth-quarter FG march to put the game out of reach...**(11/18) vs. NO:** Helped Marcel Reece to 103 rushing yards...**(12/16) vs. KC:** Held Chiefs without a sack for only the third time all year and helped pave path for 203 rushing yards, including 110 from Darren McFadden, in 15-0 win.

## 90 Desmond Bryant | DT | 6-6 | 311 | Fourth year | Harvard

**2012:** Has played in all 14 games, with six starts...Key reserve on Raiders' defensive line... **(9/10) vs. SD:** Credited by coaches with two QB hits...**(9/16) at Mia.:** Hurried Ryan Tannehill into a second-quarter incompleteness...**(9/23) vs. Pit.:** Drew a first-quarter holding penalty, then forced a Jonathan Dwyer fumble, recovered by Joselio Hanson, to snuff out a second-quarter series and set up a game-tying TD...**(10/14) at Atl.:** Selected as a game-week captain prior to contest...**(10/21) vs. Jac.:** Blasted Rashad Jennings for a loss on third-and-1, forcing a second-quarter punt, then sustained an elbow injury in the second half and did not finish...**(10/28) at KC:** Forced an incompleteness just before half with a pressure and QB hit on Matt Cassel...**(11/4) vs. TB:** Taken to Eden Medical Center during halftime with an accelerated heart rate, and spent night in hospital under observation...**(11/11) at Bal.:** Cleared by doctors to return to practice, actually started at DT in place of an inactive Seymour (hamstring), his first start since the end of the 2011 season; dropped Ray Rice for a 2-yard loss in the first quarter...**(11/18) vs. NO:** Started again in Seymour's place and nearly picked off Drew Brees on a fourth-quarter screen pass to Pierre Thomas...**(11/25) at Cin.:** Delivered third-down pressure to force an Andy Dalton incompleteness and a punt on Cincinnati's first

possession of second half...**(12/2) vs. Cle.:** Posted three quarterback hits as well as his first career blocked kick, deflecting a Phil Dawson field goal late in the third quarter, ending Dawson's longest active streak of successful NFL FGs; Oakland scored a TD on its next possession...**(12/06) vs. Den.:** Dropped Peyton Manning in the second quarter, his first sack since Dec. 11, 2011...**(12/16) vs. KC:** Made his sixth straight start in place of an injured Seymour, and notched a sack for a second consecutive game; drew a facemask penalty just before grounding Brady Quinn on game's second play in 15-0 win, Oakland's first shutout in 10 years...On second series, dropped Peyton Hillis for no gain, helping limit Chiefs to 119 total yards, fewest by a Raiders defense since 1975, and helped Oakland match its franchise record by allowing just 10 rushing yards.
